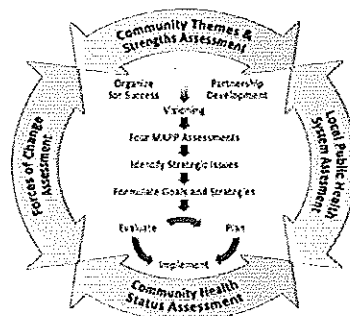


COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN AND PROCESS (CHIPP) – UPDATE



What is a CHIPP?

- Community Health Improvement Plan and Process
- A comprehensive method to gather data to determine community health needs AND.... To establish action plans to resolve those needs



What were the priorities of the 2010-2015 CHIPP?

- ▶ Access to Care
- ▶ Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse
- ▶ Mental Health

- ▶ 3 CHIPP Response Planning Committees formed around health priority areas
 - ▶ 10 defined and measurable objectives implemented for a 2 year period – June 2013 to June 2015



Current CHIPP Process

- ▶ Data driven – information derived from four separate nationally recognized assessments
- ▶ Inclusive
 - ▶ Steering Committee represents individuals from 12 different 'sectors' including business, education, consumers, faith-based organizations, government, non-profits & healthcare
 - ▶ Multiple opportunities for the general public to weigh in
 - ▶ Quality of life survey
 - ▶ Public forums to provide feedback on community needs



Initial priority needs

Steering Committee reviewed data and discussed issues while considering criteria, including

- ▶ Does this issue have a large impact on many citizens?
- ▶ Does this issue align with state & local priorities?
- ▶ Is this an issue that we have capacity to solve?
 - ▶ Can we collaborate with others to solve this issue?
 - ▶ Does this issue have negative consequences if we do not address?



Our initial conclusions:

High impact issues in Waukesha County:

- ▶ Alcohol use
- ▶ Communicable diseases
- ▶ Healthcare navigation including managing chronic conditions
- ▶ Mental health
- ▶ Opiate use
- ▶ Nutrition and physical activity



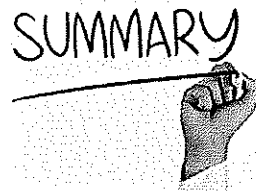
Overarching concerns

- ▶ Impact of poverty
- ▶ Workforce gaps and challenges

CHIPPA Influencers





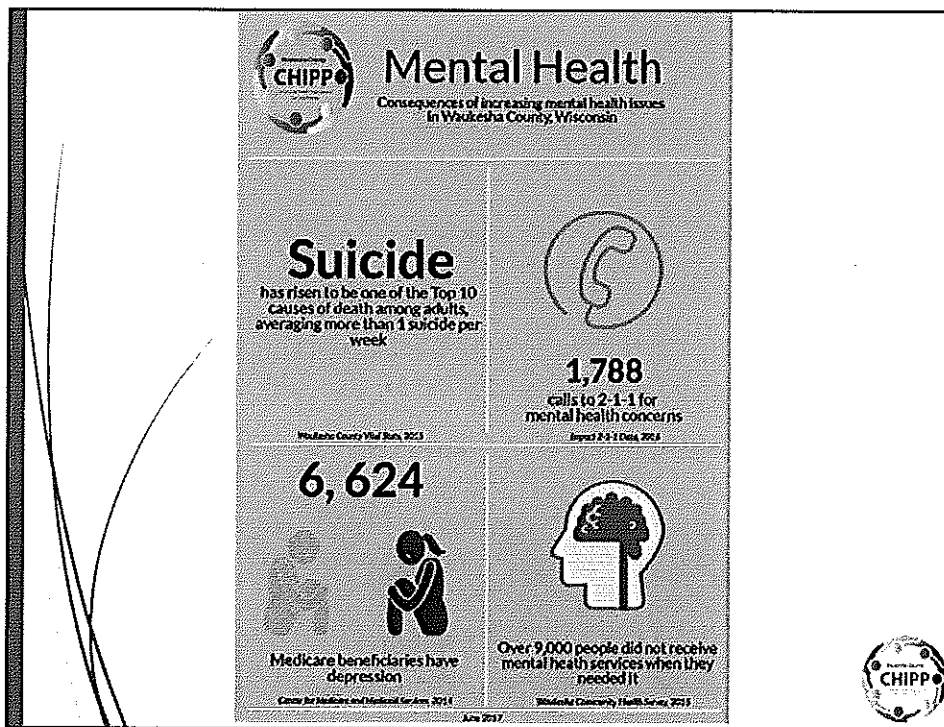
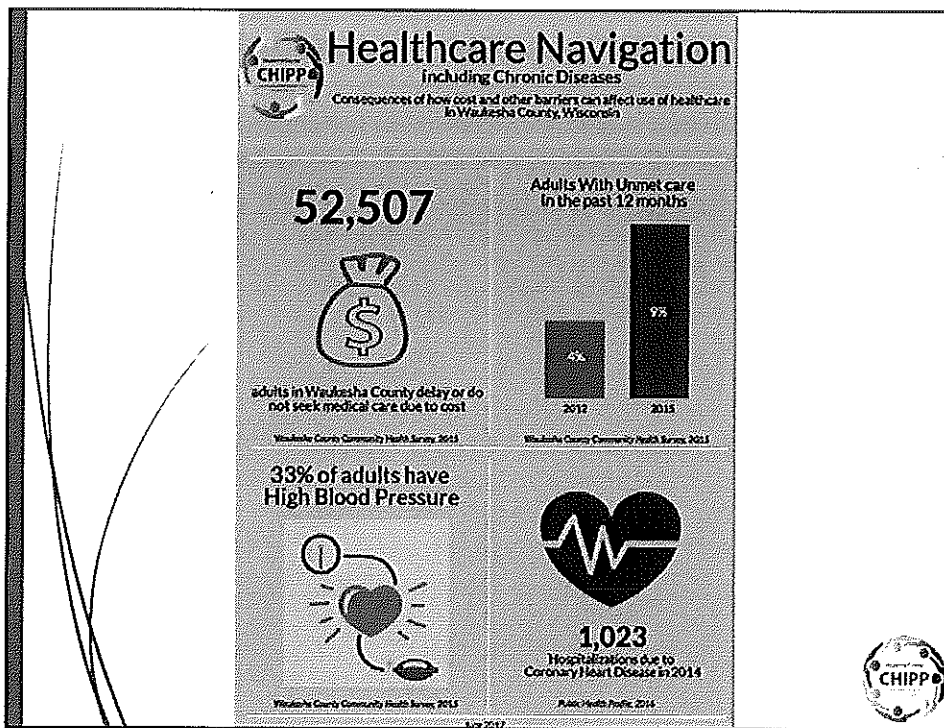
Number of Reported Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs) in 2012-2016




Your opinion matters!

Almost 1,000 Waukesha County residents provided feedback on the 6 identified issues

- ▶ They were asked to invest 'dollars' with the following instructions:
 - ▶ Imagine you had \$100 to invest in solving the major health issues impacting our community. *How would you invest your dollars?*
 - ▶ You can spend all \$100 in a single area, or spread the dollars among many different priorities with the final total amount adding up to \$100




Public feedback results



973 Voices heard

1. Opiates	\$27,320
2. Mental health	\$27,180
3. Alcohol	\$12,870
4. Nav/Chronic Disease	\$11,140
5. Nutrition/Phys Activity	\$10,630
6. Communicable Dis	\$6560



Narrowing six to a precious few

Criteria-based assessments and discussions:

- ▶ The strategic health issue ranking based on CHIPP Steering Committee evaluation of all of the assessment data
- ▶ The strategic health issue is a priority for the community (community feedback survey)
- ▶ The strategic health issue meets the CHIPP Vision
- ▶ There is community readiness for action
- ▶ There is community capacity for action
- ▶ There is a likelihood of affecting change as a collaborative coalition
- ▶ What is the magnitude of consequence if nothing is done
