The Brookfield East High School incident resulted in charges of \$6390.73. The Hwy 41 Diesel Release incident resulted in charges of \$8,396.88. Matt Redmann and Anna Ruzinski reported they participated in an active shooter tabletop exercise with Harley Davidson, Menomonee Falls Police Department, Menomonee Falls Fire Department, and the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department. Participants thought there was great interaction between the public and private sectors and took away multiple "lessons learned" for how to improve responses in an actual incident. Ruzinski said the MFPD was also working with Kohl's Corporate to conduct an active shooter exercise.

Ruzinski also reported that many schools applied for the school safety grants provided by the state, and that the required sign off by law enforcement agencies on the grant applications improved the communication and coordination between the schools and law enforcement.
