- 4) The parties, or if represented their respective counsel, must meet and confer with the other parties or their counsel in an effort to agree upon deadlines to include in the form scheduling order; and,
- 5) To satisfy the meet and confer obligation contained in this Order, the Court does not require that the parties meet in person but only that the parties communicate directly to accomplish the goal of proposing a mutually agreeable schedule for the litigation of the case; and,
- 6) Plaintiff is responsible for filing the proposed Scheduling Order in WORD format using the updated civil division form no later than 45 days after the Order is entered in the case, but no later than seven days prior to any scheduling conference scheduled by the Court; and,
- 7) If the parties cannot agree upon deadlines in the scheduling order, plaintiff must file a proposed scheduling order in Word format pursuant to Civil Division Local Rule 1.5, specifying the differences in the parties' positions and the basis for them so that the Court can order an appropriate deadline in the scheduling order if a timely objection is filed consistent with Local Rule 1.5; and,
- 8) This Order is subject to modification upon further order of the Court.
