

Women's Health and Recovery Project (WHARP) Information for Providers

The *Women's Health and Recovery Project (WHARP)* is a collaboration between women and a county-level agency facilitating care coordination, peer support, and collaborative referrals to various community services. A Navigator and a Peer Specialist work one-on-one with women to provide support and overcome obstacles that would typically be a barrier to women in their recovery journey.

Benefits agencies and clients have received: Complimentary care to increase engagement in your program's services provided to the woman in her recovery journey.

Benefits include:

- Assistance for childcare funding while in treatment
- Care Coordination/ Peer support services
- Recovery support service (Ex: recovery community, resources, events, etc.)
- Transportation
- Budgeting assistance

Assistance navigating systems such as:

- Benefits: insurance, Foodshare, childcare
- Health/dental services
- Basic needs
- Child welfare
- Treatment courts
- Additional support services

Funding options are also available for underinsured and uninsured women to receive substance use treatment in the community agency of their choice.

Eligibility: Women with substance use disorders and complex needs, who reside in Waukesha County. <u>Women do not need to be involved in any treatment or Waukesha County services.</u>
