REPORTS & COMMISSION BUSINESS

- 8. WRRTC Financial Report Huttenburg, Treasurer
 - o Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Morris/Kanard. Passed Unanimously.
 - Motion to approve payment of bills: Boardman & Clark \$4,002.00 (2023-\$2,875.00 and 2024-\$1,127) and Johnson & Block \$1,050.00 (2022 Audit done in 2023). Ranum/Orr. Passed Unanimously.

Huttenburg summarized the financial statements for month ending January 31, 2024.

9. Wisconsin & Southern Railroad's Report on Operations – Lucht, WSOR

Lucht supplied commission with 2023 production totals including 2023 maintenance and capital expenditures report and 2024 track maintenance plan. 2024 is expected to exceed 2023 in spending with work on the Merrimac Bridge and Baraboo Bridge in progress. The Fox Lake Sub has been

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very busy, and there will be a lot of updating over the next 5 years. Bolitho asked Lucht to send detail on the Fox Lake Sub mile post where work will be occurring in 2024. Crews spray 700 miles of track for weeds, trim brush, and perform geometry testing on every foot of rail every year. Lucht stated that the Reedsburg Sub work is associated with tie projects and there is a state project planned in 2024.

10. WisDOT Report – Mohlke / Stern - WisDOT.

Mohlke reported that the Merrimac Bridge project is going well, one large span has been manufactured and Kedzior will send more information; the Janesville Bridge MOU is expected within the next couple of days, once approved and signed by UP and WisDOT, it will need to be reviewed and approved by the WRRTC, the FRA requires encumbered by June 30th, design could take about a year, and work could possibly begin in 2026.

11. Committee Updates - Trail Committee and/or Litigation Committee

Krueger stated that the Sauk County agreement has been shared with Dane County, Dane County has agreed to the template with minor changes, it is now in WRRTC attorney hands for review, and will be a future agenda item. The Trail Committee will review the removal contract and make recommendation to full commission. Chris James, Dane County, stated that they are compiling the public comments received and will update the Commission soon, and MSA estimate was about \$5,800 to procure bids.

12. Attorney Updates - Attorney Brownlee Retirement

Commission received letter of retirement from Attorney Eileen Brownlee at Boardman & Clark. Commission thanked Brownlee for her 40 years of service and wished her well in retirement. Brownlee will attend April and May meeting with pending retirement date in May, 2024.

13. Permits / Applications for approval, if any -.

- Temporary Authorization Permit (TAP), Krupp GC, LLC, 131 South Fair Oaks, Madison.
 - Motion to approve the TAP as presented with changes as directed by Stern, see packet. Kannard/Gilberts. Passed Unanimously.

14. Undocumented Private Rail Crossings – WSOR or Attorney

 Motion to request WSOR provide a sample of the letter with specifics they intend to send regarding unpermitted crossing for Commission review. Orr/Huttenburg. Passed Unanimously.

Lucht stated that there are over 200 private undocumented/unpermitted crossings which are a huge liability to the railroad; there needs to be agreements in place; the draft prepared by WRRTC attorney is a good starting point and WSOR looks forward to working together to get these crossings in compliance. Lucht stated that WSOR intends to start on the Waukesha Sub and provide Commission with updates on the process, and continued discussion on farm crossings and the variations needs to occur.

15. Offer to purchase, McHenry Co., IL, Parcel #04-22-100-006

Potter stated that this is a standard boiler plate letter, and no follow-up or action is recommended.

16. Baraboo Installation of Sewer Line on Baraboo Bridge – WSOR & Wis DOT

Lucht stated that WSOR has been trying for months to work with Baraboo in getting the sanitary sewer removed; there are 66 holes in the bench wall, 11 of which penetrated rebar; Baraboo needs to mitigate the damage that they caused, fortunately we had a mild winter; however, this needs to be resolved before the freeze/thaw really affects the bridge. There have been meetings with Baraboo, WSOR, and WisDOT over the last couple of weeks; the city has a directional bore just north of the line; another meeting is scheduled for March 15th where Baraboo should provide a plan, solution, and timeframe for compliance. Stern stated that the city is claiming to have no money and they are in process of applying for federal and state grants.
