Live Webinar: Blocked Care: What To Do When You Run Out of Compassion

If you are a parent or caregiver, are you ashamed and bewildered by your lack of compassion? If you're a professional, are you confused by parents who seem resistant to your suggestions? There is neuroscience behind why parents may feel ineffective and may experience a sense of apathy called block care. Blocked care is a self-protective mechanism in a parent's nervous system activated by excessive stress. This suppresses the higher brain functions needed for caregiving, causing their nervous system to develop a defensive stance toward their child. In this session, we'll use neuroscience to explain how parents can shed their shame and make powerful changes, so they can reclaim the compassionate parent they want to

Let's Cook! Turkey Ranch Roll-ups By: thepinningmama.com

Does it get any better than refreshing turkey, bacon and cheese rolled up in a tortilla on a hot summer day? Heading for a picnic and looking for something simple to prepare and pack in the cooler? Look no further!

Ingredients:

- ີ 4 12" Soft Tortillas
- 8 oz. package Cream Cheese, Softened
- 1 Tbsp Ranch Powder Mix
- 1/4 cup Sharp Cheddar Cheese
- 1/4 cup Sweet Bell
- Pepper, Finely Chopped
- 2 Tbsp Red Onion, Finely Chopped
- 1/4 lb. Turkey Breast Deli Meat, Very Thinly Sliced

Instructions:

- Mix softened cream cheese with the ranch powder, cheddar cheese, bell pepper, and onion until well combined.
- Spread about 2 Tbsp of this mixture on each tortilla.
- Lay 3-4 slices of turkey breast flat on top of the cheese mixture to cover in a single layer
- Roll the tortilla up gently, yet tightly, to make sure it holds together and keeps its shape.
- 5. Use a serrated knife to gently slice the roll up into 5-6 slices.
- Eat immediately or refrigerate to firm up and serve later.

Let's Craft! Mini Upcycle Plant Pots By: ProjectsWithKids.com


Has your Play-Doh dried up? Or maybe the colors got all combined that you no longer need 4 containers when 1 will apparently do (No judgement here... I speak from experience!! I was all about the "marble look" when I was a kid!)? Well... now we have a great idea for you to upcycle those Play-Doh containers! And your kiddos will love watching the plant grow before their eyes!

What You'll Need:

- Old Play-Doh
 Containers (Mini or Standard Size)
- Decorative Tape
- Scissors
- □ Dirt
- Spoons
- Pack of Flower Seeds of Choice or Succulents
- Screwdriver (to punch drainage holes in the Bottom of the containers)

What You'll Do:

- Choose your Play-Doh containers. Can be mini ones and slightly bigger ones. Make sure your containers are washed and dry before you begin. Choose your decorative tape.
- Give each kid a pair of scissors so they can easily cut the tape. This will be easier for some depending on their age.



- Punch drainage holes in the bottom of the containers. This should be done by an adult. Put about 4 holes in each container to make sure that the water has lots of space to drain out.
- You want to fill your containers about halfway with dirt. If using flower seeds, plant per instructions on packet. If using succulents, don't fill it up more or there won't be enough room for the plant and its roots.
- Place your plant in the planter and then fill up the rest of the way with more dirt. Water your plants right away. Place the lids underneath and admire their cuteness!
