

Environmental Corridors:

The Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) maps Primary and Secondary Environmental Corridors and Isolated Natural Resource Areas (INRA) approximately every five years. These are parts of the landscape that contain concentrations of significant natural resource features such as lakes, streams, shorelands, floodlands, wetlands, woodlands, steep terrain, poorly drained soils and prairies. The SEWRPC Environmental corridor and INRA boundaries are displayed on the [Waukesha County GIS](#) (zoom to your area of interest and check the “Environmental” box). Environmental corridors and Isolated Natural Resource Areas within the county’s zoning jurisdiction are zoned to the Environmental Corridor Overlay District, consistent with the boundaries depicted in the SEWRPC inventory. In-field determinations by a qualified professional may be necessary to locate actual resource boundaries.
