

ENROLLED ORDINANCE 166-123

ACCEPT JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT) TRAINING GRANT AWARDED THROUGH THE WISCONSIN OFFICE OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE (OJA) AND MODIFY WAUKESHA COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES - CRIMINAL JUSTICE COLLABORATING COUNCIL 2012 BUDGET TO AUTHORIZE GRANT EXPENDITURES

WHEREAS, federal grant funds are available through the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) as the State Administering Agency to local law enforcement agencies and Criminal Justice Coordinating Councils (CJCCs) on behalf of counties, and

WHEREAS, these grant funds became available in 2012, and the OJA has recently awarded Waukesha County \$49,500 of these grant funds, which are not included in the 2012 adopted budget, and

WHEREAS, the fiduciary agent for the grant is the Waukesha County Department of Health and Human Services (H&HS), and

WHEREAS, H&HS management desires to make use of a portion of these funds for the CJCC to subcontract with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) of Waukesha to facilitate two week-long Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training sessions for local law enforcement officers, and

WHEREAS, this training will allow law enforcement officers to receive the education and tools necessary to properly recognize individuals with mental illness and refer them to appropriate mental health services in the community, avoiding arrest and diverting them from jail, and

WHEREAS, H&HS management desires to make use of the remainder of these funds to provide stipends to local law enforcement agencies within Waukesha County to assist with coverage of law enforcement responsibilities while their officers complete the 40-hour Crisis Intervention Team training and certification facilitated by NAMI of Waukesha, and

WHEREAS, this grant funding is planned to be used to serve an estimated 23 law enforcement officers within Waukesha County, with an estimated stipend payment of \$1,500 per officer provided to local law enforcement agencies, and

WHEREAS, grant funding for this training is expected to be available for a six month period, from April 1, 2012 through September 30, 2012, and

WHEREAS this grant funding will be used to enhance an existing OJA JAG grant that was awarded in 2011 of \$100,000 (Enrolled Ordinance 166-17), with approximately \$37,000 remaining that was carried over into the 2012 CJCC budget, and is estimated to provide stipends to law enforcement agencies for the training of an additional 24 officers during these two planned trainings, mentioned above.


THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WAUKESHA COUNTY ORDAINS that the Waukesha County Department of Health and Human Services – Criminal Justice Collaborating Council is authorized to accept a Justice Assistance Grant Crisis Intervention Team Training award of up to \$49,500 from the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance to help cover the cost of crisis intervention training of local law enforcement officers.



ACCEPT JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT)

ASSISTANCE (OJA) AND MODIFY WAUKESHA COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH  
AND HUMAN SERVICES – CRIMINAL JUSTICE COLLABORATING COUNCIL 2012  
BUDGET TO AUTHORIZE GRANT EXPENDITURES

This ordinance authorizes the County Department of Health and Human Services (H&HS) – Criminal Justice Collaborating Council program to accept and appropriate \$49,500 of federal grant funding, awarded through the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance (OJA). The CJCC Coordinator indicates that grant funding is planned to be used to provide training to municipal police and Sheriff's deputies to properly recognize troubled individuals with mental illness and refer them to appropriate mental health services. The OJA has indicated that the grant funding period will run from April 1, 2012 through September 30, 2012.

According to the CJCC Coordinator, \$34,500 of this grant funding is planned to be used to provide a stipend of \$1,500 per officer (for approximately 23 officers) to law enforcement agencies within the county. This is funding is to help partially cover the cost of law enforcement coverage needed while their officers complete the 40-hour crisis intervention training. The CJCC Coordinator plans to use the remaining \$15,000 to subcontract with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) of Waukesha, to facilitate two training sessions during the grant period. Previously awarded grant funding from the OJA (Enrolled Ordinance 166-17, titled "Accept 2009 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant. . .") of \$37,000 remains, and is planned to cover stipends to train an estimated 24 additional law enforcement officers during these two training sessions.
