

ENROLLED ORDINANCE 166-83

ACCEPT CRIMINAL JUSTICE JAG SMARTER SENTENCING TRAINING 2009 GRANT  
AWARD THROUGH THE WISCONSIN OFFICE OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE

WHEREAS, federal grant funds are available through the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) as the State Administering Agency in the amount of \$20,153, and

WHEREAS, these grant funds became available after the 2012 budget was adopted, and

WHEREAS, the fiduciary agent for the grant is the Waukesha County Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and

WHEREAS, HHS – Criminal Justice Collaborating Council (CJCC) desires to use these funds to host the Research-Based Smarter Sentencing Training on January 19 – 20, 2012, through a subcontract with facilitators from the Justice Management Institute and The Carey Group, and

WHEREAS, this program will provide training to:

- reduce reliance on the expensive sanction of incapacitation through incarceration in jail and prison;
- enhance the ability of persons released from jail and prison, whether under community supervision or not, to lead law-abiding lives;
- improve the capacity of the local criminal justice system to change offender behavior and reduce recidivism; and,
- create and institutionalize a process of “smarter” sentencing that will increase the capacity of local criminal justice stakeholders, both individually and collectively, to protect public safety, and

WHEREAS, the grant funding will be used to train approximately 50 justice system professionals from Dodge, Kenosha, Ozaukee, Milwaukee, Racine, Rock, Walworth, and Waukesha counties how to apply the knowledge about “what works” in changing offender behavior during the adjudication phase of the criminal justice process in an effort to reduce recidivism and costs of incarceration, and

WHEREAS, the grant funding period for this project is from January 1, 2012 to March 31, 2012, and

WHEREAS, this one-time project is expected to end at the completion of the three-month grant period.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAUKESHA ORDAINS that the Waukesha County Department of Health and Human Services- Criminal Justice Collaborating Council is authorized to accept the Criminal Justice: JAG Smarter Sentencing Training 2009 Grant in the amount of \$20,153, for the purpose of hosting the Research-Based Smarter Sentencing Training.



FISCAL NOTE

ACCEPT CRIMINAL JUSTICE: JAG SMARTER SENTENCING TRAINING 2009 GRANT  
AWARD THROUGH THE WISCONSIN OFFICE OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE

This ordinance authorizes the H&HS Criminal Justice Collaborating Council to accept and appropriate \$20,153 to be used to host the Research-Based Smarter Sentencing Training on January 19-20, 2012. Grant funding is planned to be used to pay for a consultant to conduct the training sessions, estimated at \$12,000; for participant travel, conference room rental and related costs, estimated at \$4,445; for printing costs (e.g., training manuals), estimated at \$1,500; and for countywide and H&HS department indirect cost recovery, estimated at \$2,208.

This ordinance results in no additional direct tax levy impact.
