COUNTY CIRCUIT COURT****ORDER**


WHEREAS, pursuant to SCR 70.19(3)(a), the Chief Judge is responsible for the "assignment of judges within each judicial administrative district," and

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial Administrative District finds it in the best interest of judicial administration to rotate and reassign the caseloads of the following judges;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that, effective August 5, 2013:

1. All criminal cases previously assigned to the Honorable Patrick C. Haughney, Circuit Court Judge, Branch 6, including specific assignments, be reassigned to the Honorable Lloyd V. Carter, Branch 4 in courtroom 162.
2. All family cases previously assigned to the Honorable Lloyd V. Carter, Branch 4, including specific assignments, be reassigned to the Honorable J. Mac Davis, Circuit Court Branch 7 in courtroom 187.
3. All civil cases previously assigned to the Honorable J. Mac Davis, Circuit Court Branch 7, including specific assignments, be reassigned to the Honorable Patrick C. Haughney, Circuit Court Branch 6 in courtroom 267.
4. All juvenile cases previously assigned to the Honorable Michael O. Bohren, Circuit Court Branch 1, including specific assignments, be reassigned to the Honorable William J. Domina, Circuit Court Branch 11 in courtroom JC124
5. All criminal cases (excluding drug treatment court matters) previously assigned to the Honorable William J. Domina, Circuit Court Branch 11, including specific assignments, be reassigned to the Honorable Michael O. Bohren, Circuit Court Branch 1 in courtroom 219
6. All Alcohol Treatment Court cases previously assigned to the Honorable William J. Domina, Circuit Court Branch 11, be reassigned to the Honorable Kathryn W. Foster, Circuit Court Branch 12.
7. All PR and IN estate and trust cases will be assigned to the Honorable Lloyd V. Carter, Circuit Court Branch 4.
