## Waukesha County Communications Accountability Oath

*I recognize that Waukesha County Communications* is a Public Safety Answering Point that serves the citizens who live, work and enjoy recreational activities in Waukesha County. As a team of professional emergency telecommunicators, the public depends on us to answer their calls for help and to deliver life-saving instructions when appropriate and possible. Engaging in this kind of crisis work exposes all members of our PSAP to both acute and post-traumatic stress, thus placing us at a higher risk for strained communication that can damage our PSAP relationships and our mission.

Therefore I endorse this 911 Accountability Oath to support this mission, promote personal health, to enjoy healthy relationships with my peers and commit to honoring the following tenets to the best of my ability:

I will express appreciation for PSAP team members' positive characteristics and efforts.

*I will not gossip* or participate in gossip (sharing any negative messages about a third party's behavior or character), whether I believe it to be true or not. Instead, I will dismiss it without promoting it or passing it on. I will advise the complaining person to resolve the concern directly with the other party.

*I will welcome other PSAP members* who respectfully bring concerns to me. I will strive to *humbly listen* and seek to understand before seeking to be understood while avoiding a defensive reaction or dismissing their concerns.

*I will go directly to a PSAP member* and respectfully express my concern if I truly consider his or her *conduct or performance harmful* to me, other staff or the organization's mission or operations. In doing so, I will use volume, word choice and messages free of insult or attack on character.

*I will maintain confidentiality* about matters brought to me or that I bring to others except:

When I need support or help of a peer, immediate supervisor or professional counselor to sort out my concerns in the best interest of all parties involved.

When our 911 center policy or state/federal laws requires me to notify and seek direction from my superior(s) about the matter.

When I have already tried several times to respectfully state the concern to the person without success. In such a case, before involving other supervisory or management personnel, I will ask my *immediate supervisor* to oversee a confidential discussion of the issue with the other party.

When a serious imminent risk of harm to self, others or the organization exists that requires the involvement of third parties to ensure safety.

I will inspire my peers to honor this oath by my example and by offering personal support encouraging them to seek help if needed.

## To uphold this oath, I will:

Seek opportunities for continuing education on healthy communication and stress/trauma management

Pursue professional help if job-related stress puts my health or work-performance at risk

Outside of the Communications Center as a member of society we are held to a higher standard and should live as the example, not the problem.

While at the Communications Center uphold our Core Values of Family, Integrity, Respect, Responsibility, Service, and Trust.
