Recycling Program Update – Waukesha County released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for processing and marketing recyclable materials on November 13th. We are looking forward to receiving proposals from potential vendors by mid-December and are planning for a 10 year contract, anticipated to commence in March of 2025. After thorough consideration, Waukesha County has decided against pursuing a public/private MRF solution and will instead focus on leveraging private processing for the efficient and effective management of recyclables.
