Recycling Facility Updates – On May 31, the Joint Waukesha County/City of Milwaukee Material Recovery Facility (MRF) experienced a severe fire event. Since that time, recycling staff have coordinated with your contracted haulers as well as local processors, like Johns Disposal and Waste Management, to ensure there is no disruption to curbside recycling service for partner communities and the approximately 100,000 households served. As we work with alternate processors, we are not provided specific contamination rates and material sales data for Waukesha County material; however, staff are actively engaged with all stakeholders to ensure quality recyclables are collected and processing costs and revenues are continually evaluated. Thank you to our community partners, contracted haulers and Johns Disposal and Waste Management for your continued support during this time.
