### OUTPATIENT SERVICES ADMINISTRATOR

### FUNCTION OF THE JOB

Under direction, administers the operation of outpatient mental health and substance use disorder treatment services, intensive outpatient, crisis intervention, and case management programs; provides clinical direction to professional staff; manages and negotiates purchased service contracts; and performs other duties as required.

## CHARACTERISTIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Administers the operation of the outpatient mental health and substance use disorder treatment services clinics, intensive outpatient, crisis intervention, and case management programs.
- 2. Directs the mental health crisis intervention program including the seven (7) day per week mobile response services.
- 3. Directs, plans, and oversees the implementation of outpatient programs, policies, and procedures.
- 4. Assesses, monitors, and evaluates outcomes of the outpatient programs to ensure effective delivery of treatment and support services.
- 5. Selects, assigns, evaluates and trains outpatient supervisory staff, and handles personnel issues or concerns.
- 6. Responsible for outpatient quality assurance programs including the monitoring, auditing, and other clinical measures applicable to effective client services.
- 7. Develops, recommends, and implements operating policies and procedures to ensure compliance with federal and state regulations, and to maximize reimbursement for services; develops and implements division wide policies and procedures.
- 8. Responsible for provision of outpatient services which includes decisions specific to scheduling, staff utilization, appropriate treatment modalities, venue, and array of services offered.
- 9. Develops, plans, and manages outpatient mental health and substance use disorder treatment services budget by projecting and reviewing expenditures and revenues.
- 10. Oversees the development of purchased service contracts to ensure that client and programmatic needs are met.
- 11. Directs and participates in the preparation of grant applications to gain funding for program operations.
- 12. Responsible for ensuring that staff maintain required credentials to practice as mental health, and substance use disorder treatment service providers.
- 13. Develops, coordinates, and presents in-service training and staff development programs.
- 14. Assists the Clinical Services Manager in the review of proposed legislation and administrative codes; and recommends action to appropriate County Board Committees.
- 15. Makes presentations and recommendations regarding outpatient programs and outcomes to County Board committees, boards, commissions, and other community groups, and provides guidance to advisory boards and commissions.
- 16. Serves as department liaison to State of Wisconsin committees and work groups as assigned.
- 17. Establishes and maintains effective professional relationships with community agencies, treatment providers, department staff, residential care facilities, public and private hospitals, justice system, courts, and the public.
- 18. Performs emergency government duties as assigned in event of Waukesha County Emergency Government declaration.
- 19. Performs other duties as required.

# QUALIFICATIONS

### Essential Knowledge and Abilities

- 9. Working knowledge of the use of psychopharmacology in the treatment of mental health and substance use disorders, and related potential reactions to or side effects of medications.
- 10. Working knowledge of computerized department program software, internet access, database, spreadsheet, word processing, and medical records programs.
- 11. Ability to direct outpatient service programs, provide effective leadership to staff, address conflict, and handle complex administrative situations.
- 12. Ability to plan, develop, implement, and evaluate programs for provided and purchased client services and referrals.
- 13. Ability to plan, assign, supervise, and evaluate the work of others.
- 14. Ability to interpret and apply agency rules, directives and policies; federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations.
- 15. Ability to utilize word processing, database, spreadsheet programs, and medical records.
- 16. Ability to establish and maintain effective professional relationships with community agencies, treatment providers, department staff, residential care facilities, public and private hospitals, justice system, courts, and the public.
- 17. Ability to effectively interact with sensitivity with persons from diverse cultural, socioeconomic, educational, racial, ethnic, and professional backgrounds, and persons of all ages and lifestyles.
- 18. Ability to effectively communicate verbally and in writing.
