

MENOMONEE PARK

Menomonee Park is part of the Waukesha County Park System. This 8,500-acre, natural resources-based system consists of diverse landscapes, high-quality natural areas, a variety of trails, and beautiful lakes, ponds and waterways.

The park is located in the Villages of Lannon and Menomonee Falls and offers countless recreational opportunities. It features 470 acres of rolling fields and shrublands, high quality maple woods, wetlands, and a 16-acre guarry pond with a large beach.

From 1880-1900, a stone quarry operated on the property, and several historical remnants of the operation still exist in the park, including an old stone crusher and a railroad spur connection that is now a link to the Bugline Trail. The Bugline is a 16-mile paved trail than runs from Menomonee Falls to North Lake. There are also many miles of unpaved trails within the park. In the winter, many of the trails are also available for cross-country skiers and snowshoers.

The "Best Woods" are some of the highest quality woods in the entire park, full of spring wildflowers and calling birds in summer. There are also three artesian wells in the park.

PARK RULES

- Park Hours Sunrise to 10 p.m.
- Daily or annual entrance permit required for all vehicles. Pay within 5 days of visit to avoid a violation.
- Speed Limit 15 MPH.
- · Park only in designated lots or areas.
- Beer and wine allowed with picnic permit. Hard liquor prohibited.
- Fires restricted to reserved facility's grill and/or fireplace. No carry-in wood allowed.
- Dogs must be leashed (6' maximum length). Electronic leashes or collars are not considered a leash. Off-leash is permitted in designated Dog Exercise Areas and Dog Swim Areas only.
- · Handlers are responsible for removal and disposal of their dog's waste in a sanitary manner.
- Youth organizations (under 18 years of age) must have adult supervision at all times.
- No hunting, shooting or trapping. Permitted on designated properties only.
- · Beach guests must follow all posted rules and follow staff directives.
- Camping guests must follow all posted rules and all campsite area rules.
- Dog Exercise Area guests must follow all posted rules.

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

- Archery: Range with targets and a raised platform.
- Beach: A 16-acre guarry pond with a swimming beach, beach house and concessions. Offering Swim At Your Own Risk hours, pending weather and water quality. Hours available at www.waukeshacounty.gov/swimming.
- **Biking:** Payed trails through the park, with access to the Bugline Trail.
- Boating: Rent a boat from our partner vendor or bring your own to use from the designated carry-in watercraft launch site. Non-motorized or electric motors only.
- **Camping:** Reserve a group or a family camp site online.
- Dog Exercise Area: Enjoy the fenced-in large or small breed areas where your dog is free to run off lead.
- **Dog Swimming Area:** Designated areas for off-leash dog swimming only.
- Fishing: From the accessible fishing pier you can catch trout, bass, bluegill, perch and crappies. We encourage and support the catch-and-release of fish. The pond is part of the DNR's Urban Fishing Program. Ice fishing can be enjoyed in the winter.
- **Hiking:** Trails of varying difficulty and length for all enthusiasts. Some trails open during winter for hiking and snowshoeing.
- Horseback Riding: Bridle trails throughout the park are available from May - November.
- **Nature Viewing:** See a wide variety of plants, animals and birds. Report observations to the County's iNaturalist.org "Wild in Waukesha" page: inaturalist.org/projects/wild-in-waukesha, or to eBird.org: ebird.org/hotspot/L834980.
- **Picnicking:** Grill at a first come, first served family picnic area or reserve a picnic area online for an event.
- Scuba Diving: Explore the underwater world while scuba diving the lake. A permit and release form is required and available online.
- Sledding: Sleds, tubes, and snowboards allowed on designated sledding hill.
- X-Country Skiing: Expertly groomed and tracked cross-country ski trails for both skating and diagonal techniques. There are three loops on gently rolling terrain. Winter hiking is not permitted on groomed trails.

RENTAL FACILITIES


- Picnic Areas: Two reservable picnic areas are available with a covered area, picnic tables, flush restrooms, electric, water, large grill, and a sandpit volleyball court with net.
- Fenced DEA Picnic Area: A reservable area for special events requiring a fence is available to be gated off from the rest of the Dog Exercise Area. Includes a picnic shelter, flush restrooms, water, electricity, patio and sandpit volleyball court. Large grill, picnic table and volleyball net available upon request.
- **The Beach House:** Available to rent for private events. This heated facility has a capacity of 40 and includes a sink, indoor restrooms and fireplace.
- Camp Pow Wow Lodge: Available to rent Sept.- May. This heated facility has a banquet capacity of 30 and theatre capacity of 150 and includes a freezer, sink, fireplace, indoor restrooms and patio. CAMPING

- 30 Family Campsites. Sites are limited to 2 camping units maximum and 2 vehicles maximum per site.
- 7 Group Campsites. Sites are 3 camping units minimum. Check online for vehicle capacity. Park staff will collect for additional units daily.
- Daily or annual entrance permit required for all vehicles.
- Campers must be 18 years or with a parent/legal guardian.
- Ouiet time 11 p.m. 6 a.m.
- Seven (7) night camping limit; check in 3 p.m., check out 12 p.m.
- All firewood must be purchased at the park. No carry-in wood allowed. Self-serve firewood by Family Camping is available when Park Ranger is not on duty.
- Parking on designated pavement or gravel only.
- Additional vehicles must park in designated areas.
- Flush restrooms and showers in Beach House building.
- The park does not have dump stations. A list of dump stations is available at www.waukeshacounty.gov/camping.
