Recycling Posters – Educating the public about recycling right is the best way to ensure a successful recycling program. Recycling Tip – Did you know that all recyclables should be loose, empty, and dry? Recyclables such as glass bottles, aluminum cans, and paper should not be bagged or contain significant food residue or liquids. Household Hazardous Waste Winter Schedule – There are no more one-time collection events scheduled for 2024. The site located at 1500 North University Drive in Waukesha will close at the end of November. The Menomonee Falls location is open year-round during scheduled operating hours. Recycling Program Update –Waukesha County and the City of Milwaukee are wrapping up their work with a consultant to complete a financial proforma, which includes an analysis of rebuilding the MRF ("Material Recycling Facility"). Additionally, County recycling staff are nearing completion on the development of an RFP ("Request for Proposals") and are working with a consultant to review prior to release.

Winter Salt Training Opportunities – Winter salting season is fast approaching! Look to <u>Wisconsin Saltwise</u> to find winter salt application training opportunities, equipment open houses and a lineup of Wednesday webinar topics. Waukesha County will be hosting a training event in 2025, but there are lots of training opportunities not too far away for this year.
