## Day Report Center Program Information

The Day Report Center (DRC) is a supervision program designed to be an alternative to incarceration, either as electronic monitoring, direct order of the Court or condition of probation. The DRC also monitors participants with deferred prosecution and diversion cases. The Day Report Center is located at WCS, 414 W. Moreland Blvd, Suite 203, Waukesha, WI, 53188.

## It is your responsibility to contact the DRC on the date of sentencing, or upon your release from custody, to schedule an initial appointment. The DRC office phone number is (262) 896-6806.

**Potential** fees involved with participation in the DRC program include the following:

- <u>SCRAM Continuous Alcohol Monitoring</u> (SCRAM CAM) required for participants with an alcohol-related conviction up to \$13.00 per day, with a \$50.00 install fee. Fee may be reduced with proof of indigency.
- <u>Program Fee</u> \$75.00-375.00 based on number of days ordered to the program. Fee may be waived for indigent participants or for those with deferred prosecution agreements.
- Drug Testing Confirmation Test \$31.00 per substance

Please Note: WCS Day Report Center case managers have the authority to impose additional conditions/supervision components as deemed necessary and appropriate based on information from the DRC assessment and participant evaluation. Possible supervision components include:

- Electronic Monitoring/House Arrest
- SCRAM CAM/GPS
- Preliminary Breath Tests (PBTs)
- Drug Testing
- Employment Program/Workshop
- Nutrition Class
- Thinking For a Change
- Banking Workshops
- Community Service
- Treatment, Counseling and/or Education
- Self-Help Meetings
- Anger Management/Domestic Violence Counseling/Treatment
- No Contact Orders
- Changes in Level of Supervision
- Writing Assignments including, but not limited to, essays, worksheets, journals, vision boards, etc.
