

NAGA-WAUKEE PARK

Naga-Waukee Park is part of the Waukesha County Park System. This 8,500-acre, natural resources-based system consists of diverse landscapes, high-quality natural areas, a variety of trails, and beautiful lakes, ponds and waterways.

This 414-acre parcel contains a 206-acre regional park along the shores of Nagawicka Lake. The diverse topographical features that were created during the glacial age offers many recreational opportunities and the boardwalk has spectacular views for great photo opportunities.

The oak hickory forest and thick undergrowth define the trails that wind throughout the park, which is home to many different species of wildlife. Catch glimpses of baltimore orioles, tufted titmouse, hooded warblers, and great horned owls throughout the park.

Naga-Waukee War Memorial Golf Course also makes up this large parcel. The 18-hole championship golf course was designed by golf course architect Lawrence Packard. The rugged terrain and breathtaking views of Pewaukee Lake make playing this course an unforgettable experience.

Lake access sites managed by park staff at Pewaukee, Nagawicka, and Nemahbin Lakes provide boat launches for getting out on the water with daily pass or annual lake access sticker.

PARK RULES

- Park Hours Sunrise to 10 p.m.
- Daily or annual entrance permit required for all vehicles. Pay within 5 days of visit to avoid a violation.
- Speed Limit 15 MPH.
- · Park only in designated lots or areas.
- Beer and wine allowed with picnic permit. Hard liquor prohibited.
- Fires restricted to reserved facility's grill and/or fireplace. No carry-in wood allowed.
- Dogs must be leashed (6' maximum length). Electronic leashes or collars are not considered a leash. Off-leash is permitted in designated Dog Exercise Areas and Dog Swim Areas only.
- Handlers are responsible for removal and disposal of their dog's waste in a sanitary manner.
- Youth organizations (under 18 years of age) must have adult supervision at all times.
- No hunting, shooting or trapping. Permitted on designated properties only.
- Camping guests must follow all posted rules and all campsite area rules.

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

- Beach: The beach along Nagawicka Lake has a beach house, playground, and vending machines. It is open with Swim At Your Own Risk hours, pending weather and water quality. Hours available at www.waukeshacounty.gov/swimming.
- Biking: Access the Lake Country Trail from the park.
- **Boating:** The lake access areas allow you to enjoy the lake through fishing, sailing, water skiing, canoeing, power boating and more! Daily or Annual Lake Access Permit required.
- **Camping:** Reserve a group or a family camp site online.
- **Fishing:** We encourage and support the catch and release of fish. You can catch northern, walleye, bass, bluegill, perch and crappies.
- Golfing: Naga-Waukee War Memorial Golf Course is a challenging 18-hole course with rugged terrain and scenic views of Pewaukee Lake. Located east of the park off of Maple Ave. For tee times call (262) 367-2153 or visit: www.golfwaukeshacounty.com.
- **Hiking:** Trails of varying difficulty and length for all hikers.
- **Nature Viewing:** See a wide variety of plants, animals and birds. Report observations to the County's iNaturalist.org "Wild in Waukesha" page: inaturalist.org/projects/wild-in-waukesha, or to eBird.org: ebird.org/hotspot/L2877068.
- Picnicking: Grill at a first come, first served family picnic area or reserve a picnic area online for an event.
- Play Area: The children's play structure is set next to the beach area near the beach house.



RENTAL FACILITIES

• Picnic Areas:

Five reservable picnic areas are available with concrete base covered area, picnic tables, indoor restrooms, electric, water, large grill, and sand volleyball court with net.

• The Beach House:


Available to rent from Nov. - May forprivate events. This heated facility has a capacity of 20 and includes a refrigerator, sink, and indoor restrooms.

CAMPING

- 25 Family Campsites. Sites are limited to 2 camping units maximum and 2 vehicles maximum per site.
- 5 Group Campsites. Sites are 3 camping units minimum. Check online for vehicle capacity. Park staff will collect for additional units daily.
- Daily or annual entrance permit required for all vehicles.
- Campers must be 18 years or with a parent/legal guardian.
- Ouiet time 11 p.m. 6 a.m.
- Seven (7) night camping limit; check in 3 p.m., check out 12 p.m.
- All firewood must be purchased at the park. No carry-in wood allowed. Self-serve firewood by Park Office is available when Park Ranger is not on duty.
- Parking on pavement or gravel only.
- Additional vehicles must park in designated areas.
- Flush restrooms and showers in Beach House building.
- The park does not have dump stations. A list of dump stations is available at www.waukeshacounty.gov/camping.
