CARPENTER

FUNCTION OF THE JOB

Under supervision, to perform journeyman-level work repairing, maintaining and constructing structures, buildings, and equipment, and to perform other duties as required.

CHARACTERISTIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Repairs, maintains, and constructs buildings, signs, structures, and equipment.
- 2. Builds structures or cabinetry from blueprints, sketches, or oral instructions as required.
- 3. Completes rough-in additions to existing buildings or divides rooms into offices by installing studs, dry wall, plaster, etc.
- 4. Performs finished carpentry duties, including installing woodwork, moldings, doorframes, windows, shelves, hanging doors, building cabinets, etc.
- 5. Applies paint, shellac, varnish, enamel, stain, or other protectives to prepare surfaces.
- 6. Prepares lists of materials needed to complete projects and orders or picks up those materials.
- 7. Serves as a lead worker when other employees are assigned to assist in this specialty area.
- 8. Maintains an inventory of tools, equipment, and materials needed to complete routine repairs.
- 9. Operates trucks or tractors for snowplowing, sweeps or shovels snow from steps and walks at building entrances and connecting walks.
- 10. Performs other building mechanical and maintenance work as required.
- 11. May perform duties in specialty areas including concrete, roofing, and locksmithing.
- 12. Establishes and maintains effective working relations with other employees.
- 13. Performs other duties as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

Essential Knowledge and Abilities

- 1. Thorough knowledge of the tools, equipment, materials, methods, and practices used in the construction, repair, and maintenance of building.
- 2. Considerable knowledge of occupational hazards and safe work practices.
- 3. Working knowledge of the Codes covering buildings.
- 4. Ability to analyze and to work from blueprints, sketches, and oral instructions.
- 5. Ability to follow and to direct work with written and oral instructions.
- 6. Ability to perform skilled hand and bench work in a carpenter shop.
- 7. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relations with other employees.
- 8. Ability to effectively interact with sensitivity with persons from diverse cultural, socioeconomic, educational, racial, ethnic, and professional backgrounds, and persons of all ages and lifestyles.
- 9. Ability to operate County vehicles and equipment, and CNC Sign Making Machine.

Training and Experience

- 1. High school graduation or GED equivalent.
- 2. Five years of work experience as a carpenter. Completion of a recognized apprenticeship program in carpentry can be substituted for two years of the general carpentry work experience requirement.
- 3. Possession of a valid Driver's License from the State of Wisconsin.
