Recycling Tip – Did you know that aluminum can's should not be flattened before recycling? When cans are crushed flat, it can be difficult for sorting equipment to detect the can. Contribute to recycling success at our facilities by leaving your cans intact before recycling.

At permanent sites, residents can pick up or drop off hazardous material that is still useful, free of charge. Additionally, the County continues to work with its consultant to gather data about the future of recycling processing for Waukesha County and draft a Recycling Processing Request for Proposals (RFP). The RFP will be released later this summer.
